What It Takes To Commit to Being A Volunteer To NN Puppy Adoption Program

- Utmost tender Loving Care
- Every 3 weeks - a check up - vaccination & deworming with a NN Veterinary Clinic.
- Clean shelter, food and water
- Puppies in your home for 10-12 weeks at which point they will be placed on adoption truck to be adopted to families off the Navajo reservation.
